Kathleen "Kate" Remillard knows all about physical therapy. She had her knees replaced in 2010 and 2012. In January 2014, three days after having her right hip replaced at Spencer Hospital, the 67year-old woman arrived at St. Luke Lutheran Home in a wheelchair. Kate quickly settled into her new surroundings, and with her walker and a Physical Therapy Assistant in tow, immediately began the rehabilitative process. Kate had no hesitations about coming

ton state, knew she would be safe and well cared for at St. Luke Lutheran Home.

"If you are like me and live alone, going home right after having a surgical procedure of any kind can

make you feel a little scared, especially because it is so easy to fall," she recalled. "St. Luke has a marvelous reputation and the rehabilitation is outstanding here. I have gone to quite a few physical therapists in Spencer, and the people at St. Luke are genuine and know what they are doing." Every possible precaution was taken with me. Kate added.

"You don't get that at home," she said. "St. Luke had everything to offer me and my physical therapy there was a most pleasant experience." Just as therapists

took Kate through everything she would need to do at home, she will be receiving outpatient care through St. Luke, including utilization of the indoor aquatic center for her exercise program.

"There truly is no other facility in Spencer like this," Kate said.


