### FOR THE SAFETY OF OUR RESIDENTS & TENANTS

**S**tanley Corporation and Arial Software technologies have merged to provide Hillside Terrace. Riverview Terrace, and soon St. Luke Lutheran Home with a wireless call system for residents and tenants to utilize as a way to communicate to staff when in need of help. The system is all tied to a main computer system that supports and transmits data remotely from the pressed call button to staff pagers.

This is a wireless program. Because of its mobility, the system is practical for on-the-move residents and tenants. Now, there is no reason now to be dependent on a cord. Campus residents and tenants have the choice of a necklace or wrist button.



Residents can be anywhere in their respective facility, or even outside on campus in the proximate area, and be confident they have access to help if they would need it. The system does not actually pinpoint the location, but with strong advancements in technology, we foresee this being possible with an easy future update. The pagers that staff wear now sound to indicate name, room number, date, and time when the button was pressed. The sound is repeti-

tive until the call button has been reset. The only way to reset the button is to physically see the resident or tenant and flip the button and depress a button. Another positive attribute of the new system is that the computer software stores and saves the data of each press and reset of the call buttons. We can provide audits of how long it takes staff to respond to pages or simply find out who does and who doesn't utilize the call button. This information can be accessed on up to nine different computers around campus. Each door on campus is also tied into the system and can be examined as to when it is opened or alarmed; which then can set off the pagers to alert staff.
