

lowa's Medicaid healthcare management system will move to a managed care approach effective January 1, 2016. Known officially as IA Health Link, this program will be administered by the following contracted Managed Care Organizations (MCOs):

- Amerigroup lowa, Inc.
- AmeriHealth Caritas Iowa, Inc.
- UnitedHealthcare Plan of the River Valley, Inc.
- Wellcare of lowa, Inc.

lowa Medicaid beneficiaries may stay with the MCO they are assigned to. Or they *have until December 17, 2015,* to select another MCO.

Helen has six children: Bonnie Rickabaugh of Terril, Peggy Johnson of Kansas City, David Johnson of Linn Grove, Julie Foreman of Sac City, Frank "Tony" Duhn of Burns, Oregon, and Laurie Miller of Vancouver, Washington.

At St. Luke, the great-greatgrandmother enjoys socializing with others, attending church services, participating in many activities, and maintaining her strength by swimming in the indoor aquatic center.

"I feel so very happy inside and am surrounded by a lot of good people," Helen said. "Evidently, this is exactly where I am supposed to be."
