#### **Senior Dental Care**



This partnership will allow the residents of St. Luke Lutheran Home access to quality dental services regardless of payment sources. Senior Dental Care will begin seeing residents here on January 20. 2015. The services provided include quarterly cleanings, X-rays and fillings, as well as denture or partial repair and replacement. They also will provide cancer screening and tooth extractions.

Dental insurance is available to cover the cost of these services. Medicaid

covers the cost of insurance for recipients. Other residents may choose a fee-forservice plan and pay based upon what the resident needs. Senior Dental Services is also available for emergent situations and will provide the needed care within one to two weeks. Senior Dental Services provides the necessary care and treatment at the nursing facility, so that our residents do not need to leave the building.

**PROVIDING QUALITY CARE TO OUR RESIDENTS** 

#### Encounter Telehealth Medicine



This service is another way that our residents will be able to receive mental health services within the nursing facility. This is done via a computer and monitor. One telehealth provider is a nurse practitioner that offers counseling and a medication prescription service if necessary. This provider believes in evidence-based, cost-effective medication utilization, medication reduction when indicated, and non-pharmacological interventions to meet the needs of residents being cared for.

The program will begin the second week of January. If a consultation is required, a consulting room at St. Luke will be established to provide complete privacy.

We are excited to be able to provide these two new services to our residents.



Freeman Knudtson is a disciplined veteran with a strong resolve and a heart of gold. He joined the Army in August 1942, completed basic training at Camp Haan, and served in a search light outfit along the California coast and desert. Freeman was among 20,000 Allied soldiers who traveled the North Atlantic Ocean aboard the Queen Mary troopship to Scotland. He then served within a communications company in France, Germany, Holland and Austria before being honorably discharged in February 1946. "It was a great experience," Freeman said of World War II, "but I wouldn't want to go through it again."

Upon his return to Spencer, Freeman worked briefly at the former Wilson's Elevator before serving as a mechanic for 36 years at Asher Motor Company.
