

eonardo, versatile genius of the Renaissance, was born in Vinci, Italy in 1452. Though he excelled in many fields, he is remembered today because of two wonderful paintings: the *Mona Lisa* and *The Last Supper*. In 1494, when Leonardo was 42, he was commissioned by the Duke of Milan to decorate the dining room of the convent church, which was the favorite shrine of the Duke's young bride. As the appropriate theme for this dining room, the painter chose *The Last Supper*. His painting was not intended to be a faithful reproduction of the original scene as it has taken place in First Century Palestine,

but as it might have taken place in 15th Century Italy. He chose what he considered the most dramatic moment of the last supper. In this Living Dramatization, the 12 apostles speak their minds to themselves, to each other, and to the Lord in light of the words, which they have just heard Jesus speak, "One of you will betray me."


