Mary Sembach is a very pleasant and helpful professional.

Her upbeat personality and unwavering dedication are testaments to her love for her Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) role at St. Luke Lutheran Home.

Mary's positive attitude and constant commitment to "doing the right thing" for the residents she cares for, and their families, tends to keep others she works with in a good mood.

"I am a 'people person,' so I love my job," said Mary, who first served as a fulltime CNA at St. Luke from September 2002 until

Josephine "Josie" Cromer has a heart for others.

Born near Langdon, Josie's mother died when she was 3. By the age of 9, Josie moved to an orphanage in Council Bluffs.

She immediately began learning how to crochet and started working at a nursing home Odebolt. Josie worked in 14 different nursing homes around Iowa during her over 40-year career as a Certified Nursing Assistant. Crocheting beautiful items for others was a common practice during her breaks from work. The tradition continues today, with two of

Josie taught herself to read and write with scripture.

On March 13, 1959, she married William Cromer. The couple moved to Spencer in 1977, and Josie was hired by St. Luke's former director of nursing, Querida Decker. During her 16-

year tenure as a CNA in Spencer, Josie took pleasure in spending time with her boss, the residents she cared for, and crocheting during breaks with fellow CNA Marcella Clark.

Away from work, the Cromers enjoyed eating out, traveling to visit relatives, and walking the city's streets. Josie, who moved to Riverview Terrace in October 2011, continues to walk between one and seven miles each day. The pedometer on her shoe measures Josie's daily steps taken.

"I have everything I need here," she said. "I like being able to visit with others and not being alone. I have all kinds of friends at Riverview Terrace."
