





He was introduced to, and became very active in, the Kiwanis organization. Charles, who served as Lieutenant Governor for Iowa in 1977-78, was active in Kiwanis for 30 years.

When Spencer's Northwestern Bell closed in 1980, Charles was promoted and became foreman at AT&T in St. Louis.

He retired in 1988 in order to care for his wife, who had been diagnosed with breast cancer.

In 1990, the Scheils returned to Northwest Iowa and built a home in West Okoboji.

Family remains important to Charles, who now also claims nine grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren.
