Doyle Anderson and Lela dated throughout their years at Cornell High School, where she was a cheerleader and known for her singing abilities and piano playing. The summer after high school graduation, August 1946, Lela was selected by movie star Ronald "Dutch" Reagan from a field of seven beauties, and was crowned queen of the Storm Lake semipro baseball tournament.

Together, Doyle and Lela Anderson managed a grain and livestock farm northwest of Linn Grove. It hosted two herds of milk cows and 2,000 laying hens.

Please join in congratulating The Rev. Elizabeth Cone Preston for her ordination to the Sacred Order of Priests.




