

When Fred retired in 1984, the couple bought a condominium at Airport Villa in Spirit Lake. Not working didn't suit Fred, so he quickly began

co-managing the apartment buildings and swimming pool at Airport Villa, as well as started an electrical business with friend Dean Ricker in which the two worked electrical jobs within a 50-mile radius of the Iowa Great Lakes region.

He also served as a Eucharistic minister, or communion steward, for years while a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church in Spirit Lake.


In June 2012, Fred and Cleona moved to Riverview Terrace Assisted Living.


