Her parents, who traveled from Sweden to settle in northwest Iowa, instilled in her and her six siblings the importance of learning new things, adjusting to their circumstances, and continuing their educations.

Music has always been a guiding force for Elayne. She was first placed on a stage as a 4-year-old to sing, "My Blue Heaven." When her younger sister was old enough, she joined Elayne, their two older sisters and two friends to become "Four Flats and a Sharp," which sang on KICD Radio and to local audiences. Elayne learned to read music, as well as play it by ear on the piano.

Elayne, an active choir member, graduated from the country consolidated Highview High School in 1943. She attended Augustana University in Sioux Falls for one year before transferring to Buena Vista College in Storm Lake.

In 1945, she met Everett Grapenthin, an outgoing young man who played on the Linn Grove High School and Buena Vista football teams. The couple married on August 1, 1948.

on her son who pitched for the Montreal Expos baseball team, and never missed attending a grandchild's school event. She also is an avid Minnesota Twins and Iowa State University fan.

Elayne crafted clothing for her children, sewed wedding dresses for her daughters, and has made many quilts. She likes to cook and enjoys family gettogethers and spending special times with relatives. Traveling with her two sisters for three weeks in Sweden, visiting relatives, is among Elayne's most memorable vacations to date.

Elayne moved to Riverview Terrace Assisted Living in July 2014 before transferring to St. Luke Lutheran Home in July 2017. At St. Luke, she always has a smile and positive, observant comment ready to give. She loves to hear cardinals and bluebirds singing outside her window, and makes sure that visiting bluebirds and hummingbirds have plenty to eat. Participating in exercise classes, attending chapel, making jewelry, visiting with others and attending Sunday services fill her days.

"The people here and the workers here at St. Luke Homes & Services, are so friendly and helpful," Elayne said.

Elayne represented her church as a St. Luke Lutheran Home Auxiliary member for many years.



When the Eischeids retired in 1972, their five children bought the Spencer livestock sale barn. The family-run business featured Mary, and her well-known hot beefs and pies in the café, until 1 p.m., when she transitioned to help in the office.

During her tenure at the sale barn, Mary continued to clean others' homes, including Monsignor Robert Joynt's. The Sacred Heart Church member also canned a lot of foods for her family over the years. Today, pickled asparagus rates as her favorite food.
